Bienvenue, Servette!

We welcome Servette Geneva to Ninian Park this evening — Cardiff City's first Swiss opponents in the 12 years of competition in the European Cup Winners' Cup during which we have played the clubs of 14 other nations.

We know that our visitors, like Cardiff, have a long record in European inter-club football and it seems a pity that two such clubs have to face each other in a preliminary round match before the start of the official League seasons in their respective countries.

European football has changed greatly since our first entry in 1964. The competitive standards have increased tremendously and it is now impossible to regard any match as easy. All clubs demand success and it is significant that Servette have recently purchased Martin Chivers from Tottenham to increase their prospects.

It is quite a coincidence that Martin's first major game for Servette should be against Cardiff City, a club managed by Jimmy Andrews who used to be his coach at Tottenham!

In this country we have noted the rise in the standards of Swiss football at both club and international level. Switzerland's fine performance against England recently demonstrated the progress that has been made and we know that many of the outstanding Swiss players are in tonight's side.

We hope that both games in this preliminary round tie will be played in the finest of sporting spirit and that the victors will go on to a successful run in this important European tournament.

IN OUR LAST COMPETITIVE fixtures of last season, we proved two points: that Cardiff City were good enough to regain their Second Division status; and that this is the premier club of Welsh football — and we won the Welsh Cup to demonstrate this to everyone.

Tonight, in welcoming Servette Geneva, we take the first step into the new season. The return to the European Cup Winners' Cup is something we wanted almost as badly as a return to the Second Division.

We are confident that the fare at Ninian Park this season will be far more attractive in prospect than it was a year ago. Then we were out of Europe and out of the Second Division: what a difference there is now in comparison!

As events turned out, the football of last season provided marvellous entertainment. Backed by the directors, manager Jimmy Andrews put together a side which delighted thousands of supporters. We believe, after playing together in a successful season, this squad will now improve and provide even better football for the people of South Wales.

Back us in what we are trying to achieve. Last season was only the start; there is so much more to come. Crowd behaviour is so vital to the prestige and reputation of not only this club but the entire city of Cardiff. We appreciate that the vast majority of our supporters are perfectly behaved . . . help us to make that majority 100 per cent.

Success is the theme of Cardiff City. In Europe, in the Second Division, in the League Cup and in the F.A. Cup. What a season it could be at Ninian Park in 1976/77!

Players ready despite the rush from JIMMY ANDREWS



It's short notice . . . but we are ready for tonight. Training and planning for the season was intensified from the moment that we knew we would kick off the new season earlier than any other club in the League. Believe me, the players are really on edge.

I was impressed with the standard of fitness from the moment we commenced pre-season training. If we had known that we were going to play a preliminary game in the European Cup Winners' Cup this soon, I would have instructed an earlier recall — but I need not have worried. As it turned out, most of the players had been keeping

themselves fit by solo training through the summer. That shows the enthusiasm of their approach for the campaign ahead.

I have found that they are anticipating European football very keenly. They are keyed up for tonight's game: all the more so because Servette bring Martin Chivers to Ninian Park.

As a coach at White Hart Lane while Martin was top scorer for Spurs, I worked closely with him. In my opinion he is, on his day, one of the great players. I am sure his presence here this evening — plus the general attraction of the Cup Winners' Cup — will provide a marvellous way to open the season.

The Cup Winners' Cup adds a lot of flavour to the season. We are looking for success because we know how highly this competition rates as part and parcel of football at Ninian Park.

The days are over when Swiss sides were rated as not-too-tough opponents destined for early exits from European competition. The Swiss, like everyone else in Europe, now have their sights set firmly on success. The Dutch and the Belgians have shown that football triumph is possible for the smaller nations: now the Swiss are taking up the challenge as well.

Servette Geneva have demonstrated their intentions to the entire football world. You do not pay £80,000 and move a player like Martin Chivers 1,000 miles to settle for second best. The 24 times capped England striker is a bold signing: this new switch in his career will be followed with intense interest.

A look at Swiss football last season shows the exact reason for his signing. Undeniably, Servette finished second best in Swiss football last season: F.C. Zurich beat them in the race for the national league championship and then squeezed them out 1-0 in the Cup Final.

Zurich, naturally, elected to play in the European Champions Cup but Servette do not enter the Cup Winners' Cup with a limp runners-up label — indeed, they were the finest side in Switzerland when it came to shutting out opposing sides. They conceded just 14 goals in 26 matches and that was 11 goals better than any other side in the country.

Yet they finished five points behind Zurich (39 to 44) in the Swiss League. That placing, plus the narrow defeat in the Cup Final, brought home firmly to the ambitious men who run the Servette club that a goal-scorer with a reputation respected and feared throughout football would complete their side.

So Chivers is Servette's 'hired gun' and tonight's game provides him with a

major test rather earlier than either he or his new club would have wished. This preliminary tie takes place only because 33 teams were entered for the Cup Winners' Cup. One side has to be eliminated before the competition proper can start — and it was Servette and Cardiff who were drawn for an early duel.

As well as the threat of Martin Chivers tonight, Cardiff will have to combat the tight security of that defence which has two experienced internationals, Gilbert Guyot and Lucio Bizzini, in the central positions. Undoubtedly, Servette will be relying on their rearguard tonight to give them a chance of victory at home in the second leg.

Yet there are men, apart from Chivers, who have the ability to strike suddenly and successfully from quickly-mounted breaks. Alfred Hussner, Franz Barriquand and Joyo Pfister scored nine goals each last season to finish as joint top scorers.

THE PLAYERS

KARL ENGEL (Goalkeeper)

Born 1952. A Swiss 'B' international and strongly tipped to become a full 'cap' in the near future. Possesses the typical agility and lightning reactions of so many top Continental goalkeepers. Has the reputation of coming strongly off his line and with a safe pair of hands to cut out high balls.

UELI WEGMANN (Defender)

Born 1946. One of the most experienced defenders in Swiss football and with one full international, against Scotland. Usually operates on the left side of the defence where he is fast into the tackle. Uses the ball accurately.

MARC SCHNYDER (Defender)

Born 1952. An outstanding young defender and a regular partner of Wegmann in Servette's strong defence. His pace and power on the right flank is a major attacking weapon because he can launch swift 'overlap' attacks. Rated as a full back who should become a regular international over the next few seasons.

GILBERT GUYOT (Defender)

Born 1948. Servette's sweeper in the traditional European defensive pattern. A hard, sound, efficient defender whose tackling, positioning and 'reading' of opposing attacking build-ups has made him an established choice for both Servette and the Swiss national side.

LUCIO BIZZINEE (Defender)

Born 1948. His association with Guyot for both club and country has been brilliantly effective. Bizzinee operates as an orthodox centre half where his height and commanding play have proved a major factor in Servette's meagre 'goals against' record.

ALFRED HUSSNER (Midfield)

Born 1950. A player who loves to attack — as his record shows. Particularly effective in every shooting position and has the skill to carry the ball in 30 yard moves. His close control and intelligent distribution make him a constant threat to rival defences.

UMBERTO BARBERIS (Midfield)

Born 1949. Recently transferred from Zurich Grasshoppers — much to the annoyance of the supporters of his previous club. One of

the most experienced competitive players in the Servette side with a long record of success playing in the Italian League.

KURT MULLER (Midfield)

Born 1948. Another Servette player with a background of service abroad, in his case as a long serving 'general' in West Germany. Plays a cool, authoritative role in Servette's 'engine room' where he can defend and push forward as the occasion demands.

FRANCO MARCHI (Midfield)

Born 1948. Another Swiss player with long experience across the border, as a respected midfield worker in the Italian league. Possesses vast amounts of stamina and energy and his game is at its most effective when he can involve himself in every one of the 90 minutes.

CLAUDE ANDREY (Midfield)

Born 1951. A Swiss international of sparkling talent. Normally operates as a prominent 'support' player to the central strikers where his control and quick reactions in tight situations are highly effective in creating the half chance.

MARTIN CHIVERS (Front player)

A player whose formidable goal scoring ability is respected throughout world football. Scorer of almost 250 goals for Southampton, Spurs and England before his transfer to Servette this summer. His striking power with forehead and both feet — built on a 6 feet 2 ins, 12 stone physique — is aimed at bringing Servette success both at home and in Europe this season.

HANS JORG PFISTER (Front player)

Born 1951. A lively raider whose acceleration and darting raids along the right wing are a key weapon in Servette's attacking policy. An international who possesses the creative skill to pave the way for Chivers to become the top match-winner of Swiss football.

FRANZ BARRIQUAND (Front player)

Born 1949. A French player who is the main attacking threat on the left flank. As well as demonstrating the fast probing qualities of a winger, he can finish moves with fierce shooting.

DOUG - "THE PROFESSIONAL" - IS

NEW CITY TEAM SKIPPER

That descriptive headline was contributed by manager Jimmy Andrews — the day that he signed Doug Livermore shortly after the start of last season. Everything that Doug has contributed since that moment almost a year ago proved to the hilt the accuracy of the manager's label.

Now Doug takes over as team skipper. When the team returned from the trip to Majorca, he had a long chat with manager Andrews about the season now immediately ahead. "I had to be sure — because captaincy is a vital job — that Doug was the right man. I'm sure he will give to the team the leadership qualities he demonstrated in midfield last season . . . with something extra," is Jimmy's forecast.

Doug's captaincy started, in fact, on a winning note. He led the side against Hereford United in the Welsh Cup Final in the final competitive matches of last season. As a result of that victory, Cardiff went forward as the undisputed champions of Welsh football into the European Cup Winners' Cup.

"This is a marvellous challenge for me," says Doug. "The excitement of European football and the return to the Second Division. I will enjoy every moment.

"If we go about the job professionally, I'm certain that we will do well in the months ahead. We have some fine players. But there is only one way to tackle the season if you want success. Work hard at it!

"I feel that this club has so much going for it. Indeed, I have felt this from the moment I arrived. I wasn't going to sign — it wasn't the club itself; just the prospect of the Third Division. It wasn't for me.

"After all, I was already at a First Division club, Norwich City, and the drop seemed a long way into the Third.

"So I came to Ninian Park and took a long look before making up my mind. Everything impressed me. Certainly the status was Third Division but the outlook was so progressive and the set-up 'made' for success. So I took a gamble. Time has shown that it was the right one. Cardiff are back in the Second and Pompey have tumbled into the Third!

"The boss made my role crystal clear. He wanted me to take control of the midfield; to instruct, dictate, accept responsibility, make the other players involved. I was happy with this. It was a role that I relished then as I now relish the prospect of captaincy.

"As time went on and the tide started to turn in our favour, I took on more and more responsibility. Every player in the side became keyed to promotion and I found the atmosphere and situation both exciting and stimulating.

"This showed so clearly as far as I was concerned when we finally clinched promotion in that last game at Bury. The television cameras were there as we came off the pitch and I'm told it was ridiculous . . . jumping about all over the place! But that was a marvellous emotive moment and it illustrated to perfection the way I felt.

"If there was one moment I enjoyed more than any other, apart from the actual election of promotion, it came when I scored my League goal against Hereford. I don't score that many and when I do no one can hold me — I go wild! But to find the net that very special night with such a tremendous crowd inside the ground provided a memory that will last me a lifetime.

"Now please give us the backing EVERY GAME that you gave us that night."


